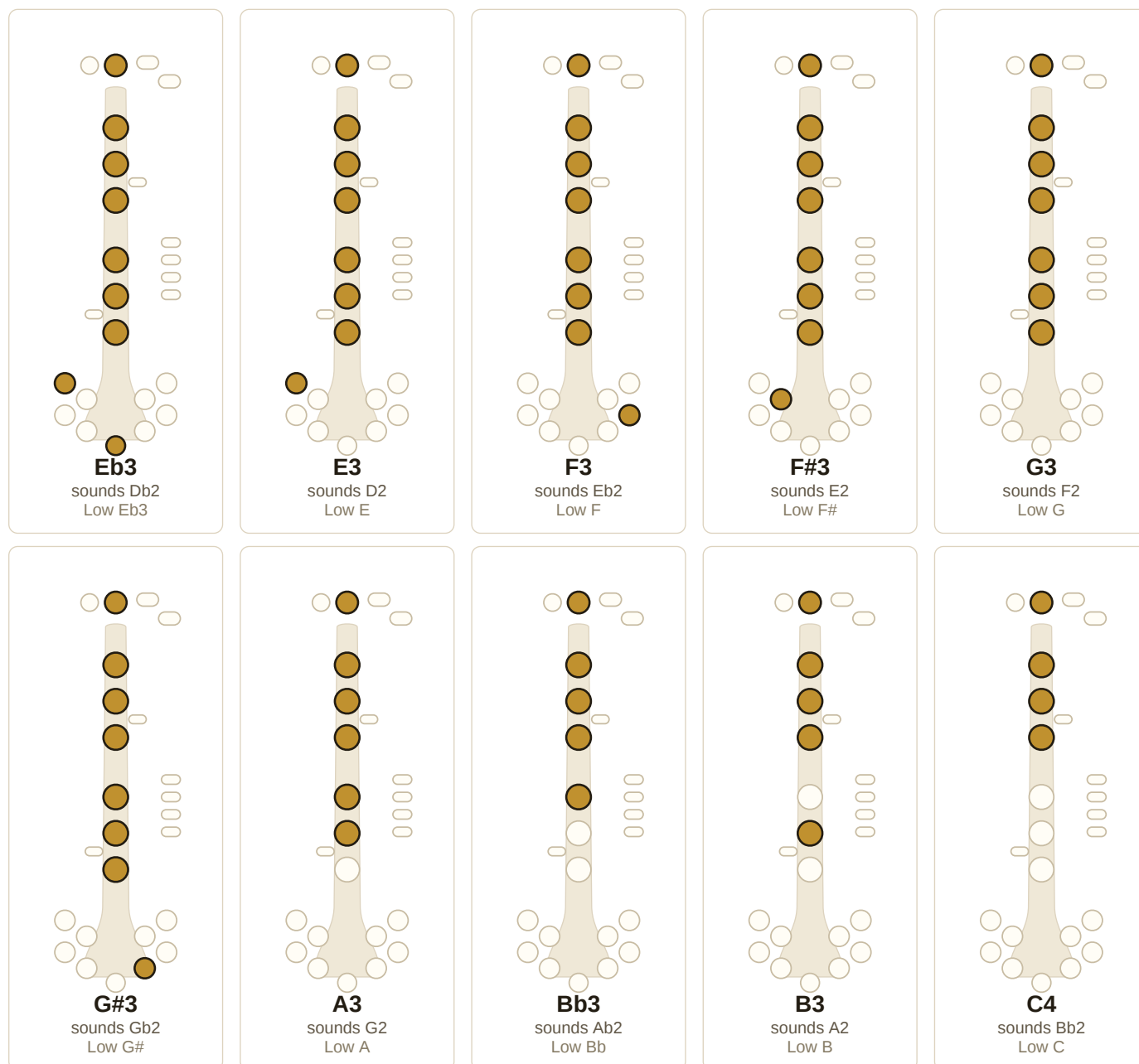


Bass Clarinet Fingering Chart
